

SGT Minutes

January 26, 2022

- Members present: Michael Keown, Mike Stowe, Jason Scott, Tonya Hopper, Kendrick Maxwell, Renee Herron, Sarah Coleman, Erin Whifield, and Quannah Martin
- The SCHS School Governance Team met at 12:00; Kendrick Maxwell called the meeting to order.
- KM made a motion to approve the October minutes; it was seconded by JS and unanimously approved.
- Renee Herron presented a dual enrollment update:
 - The policy regarding student withdrawals was updated with the following: “The student and parent/guardian acknowledge, if a student withdraws from a college course, the high school will make its best attempt to place the student in a corresponding high school or virtual course to meet course completion and graduation requirements. If no corresponding course or credit recovery opportunity is possible, the local school system shall determine how the course will be recorded: as a withdrawal or incomplete on the student’s transcript. Public school student and parent acknowledge understanding of the local school system policy regarding withdrawal from Dual Enrollment classes.”
 - The update will ensure consistency and will be added to the handbook.
 - KM made a motion to approve; JS seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.
- Michael Keown presented an administration update
 - The SGT reviewed the proposed 2022-22 school calendar. There were no questions about the calendar, and all present were pleased with the proposed dates.
 - The administration team is working on “cleaning up” the student handbook.
 - Covid: There has been a small spike, but it has had minimal impact.
 - The district updated the Covid policy: If a person is positive, they must quarantine for 5 days. Otherwise, there are no mandatory quarantines. The school will continue to track positive cases and notify parents.
 - All spring school functions will carry on as “normal” as of now.
 - Administration is looking into purchasing 40 Swivl robots and iPads.
